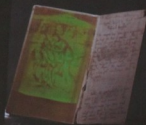

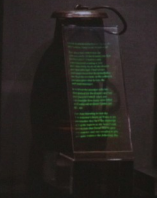

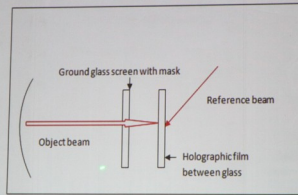

## The Analysis of A *Virtual Artist*: Audience Response - From 'Wow!' to 'A Connection'.

- The artwork elicited emotional responses from audience members
  - from surprise to frustration
- The artwork created a new experience for audience members
- Artists unfamiliar with lenticular imaging and holography were unable to detect the difference between the two
- Artists still referred to holography as a new medium, negatively affected by 'holokitch'.
- The audience didn't identify a family tree structure in the installation
- Audience members questioned did not articulate an awareness that an increased depth within the volume of the holographic space represented greater distance in time.
